Products: Medica Choice CareSM and Medica MinnesotaCare

Program Goals for each measure: A proportional 10% increase over baseline score or maintain a score of 90% or above. *Example of proportional 10% increase: If a clinic/group had a baseline score of 80%, a score of 82% is needed to meet the goal. (100-80 = 20 and 10% of 20 = 2. 80 + 2 = 82%)

Program Eligibility: Medica's Choice Care Quality Improvement Program supports health improvement goals specifically for Medica Choice Care and Medica MinnesotaCare members, enrolled in Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP). Clinic groups that serve the majority of Medica's MHCP members are eligible for this program. Program payout each year is determined by *two factors*: providers' clinical results *and* the financial performance of Medica's MCHP products. The CCQI program is specific to primary care and includes the following: family practice, internal medicine, Ob/Gyn and pediatrics. The measures included for each group are dependent on their patient population.
