Childhood Immunizations	10%	Percentage of children who received all recommended shots by 2 years of age.	Report based on claims	0 to 2 years	Percent of children who received all recommended shots by 2 years of age in 2006.
Mammography	10%	Percentage of women who received a mammogram in the past 2 years.	Medical Record Review	40-69 years	Percent of women, age 40-69, who received a mammogram in 2005 or 2006.
Pap test	10%	Percentage of women who had one or more Pap tests in the last 3 years.	Medical Record Review	21 years and older	Percent of women, age 21 or older, who had one or more Pap tests in the time range of 2004 through 2006.

**Products:** Medica MinnesotaCare and Medica Choice Care<sup>SM</sup>

**Program Goals for each measure:** A proportional 10% increase over baseline score or maintain a score of 90% or above. \*Example of proportional 10% increase: If a clinic/group had a baseline score of 80%, a score of 82% is needed to meet the goal. (100-80 = 20 and 10% of 20 = 2. 80 + 2 = 82%)

**Program Eligibility:** Medica's Choice Care Quality Improvement Program supports health improvement goals specifically for Medica Choice Care and Medica MinnesotaCare members enrolled in Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP). Clinic groups that serve the majority of Medica's MHCP members are eligible for this program. Program payout each year is determined by *two conditions*: providers' clinical results *and* the financial performance of Medica's MHCP products. The CCQI program is specific to primary care and includes the following: family practice, internal medicine, Ob/Gyn and pediatrics. The measures included for each group are dependent on their patient population.

**\*% of Incentive:** Percentage of incentive dollars available for this measure.
