Optimally Managed Vascular Care	Percent of members who have vascular disease and reached all of the following four treatment goals to reduce risk of cardiovascular diseases: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Blood pressure less than 140/90 mmHg (if the patient also has diabetes the BP must be &lt;130/80)</li> <li>LDL-C less than 100 mg/dl</li> <li>Daily aspirin use for patient</li> <li>Documented as tobacco-free in medical record</li> </ul>	MN Community Measurement Results	Health plan: claims and medical record review -- random sample  <i>OR</i> Direct data submission: must have both baseline and comparison year	18 to 75 years of age	Improvement over baseline of at least <b>4</b> percentage points	Improvement over baseline of at least <b>6</b> percentage points; <b>or</b> if at 90th percentile of MNCM aggregate	Percent of members with vascular disease who met criteria as optimally managed in 2007 (2008 MNCM measurement results report for DOS 2007)	Participating providers <sup>1</sup> eligible for MNCM and a minimum of 45 Medica <i>commercial</i> members <sup>2</sup> with vascular disease.  <b>MNCM Vascular Disease measure provider specialties include:</b> Cardiologist managing care (not device check only), Family Practice, General Practice, Geriatric Medicine, Internal Medicine, Med/Peds.  Includes provider types who manage care – MD, Physician Assistant, Nurse Practitioner

\* This measure recently changed to amend the HbA1c goal to < 8% for 2009 (from 7% in prior years). Medica measures aligned with MN Community Measurement are subject to change accordingly.
